

## Graduation Requirements (POLICY IHF-5)

The State Board of Education offers four diplomas: College Preparatory, College Preparatory with Distinction, Technology/Career and Technology/Career with Distinction. Courses listed below by program of study meet the entrance requirements for public post-secondary institutions in Georgia. Students who are planning to attend a school other than a Georgia public institution should check the specific requirements of the school that they wish to attend. In order to receive a diploma, students must also pass the Georgia High School Graduation Tests. Students working toward College Preparatory with Distinction and the Technology/Career with Distinction must obtain a grade point average in the core courses of 80 or above.
